



**City Council Public Works Committee
Minutes of June 1, 2021 Meeting**

Members Present: Councilmembers Cindi Hochstatter (chair), Curt Brown, Charla Neuman

Staff Present: Public Works Director Dahlem, City Engineer Michael Kosa, Public Works Manager Andrew Leach, Contract Administrator Kelsey White

The meeting convened at 4:02 PM. Due to Covid-19 restrictions, this meeting was held virtually.

The following topics were discussed:

Sidewalk Improvements – Construction Contract Award

Public Works Manager Leach stated this item is for the upcoming Sidewalk Improvement Project. There will be a focus on replacing non-ADA compliant curb ramps and sidewalks City wide, as well as repairing a section of sidewalk in the Rivergrove neighborhood. The project recently went out to bid and received a total of 4 bids. The lowest responsible bid was submitted by Olson Brothers Excavating, Inc. for an amount of \$1,354,693.17, which was lower than the engineer's estimate of \$1,614,920.00. The contractor will have 100 working days to complete the project. *"Do Pass Recommendation by the Committee"*

ESN Salmon Creek Cutover – Design/Construction Management Consultant Agreement

City Engineer Kosa stated the City has budgeted funds to realign Salmon Creek between 64th Street E and 60th Street E. As part of the East Sumner Neighborhood project, a new channel was constructed in 2019 but vegetation needed to be established before the creek could be moved over. The old ditch will remain in place to collect stormwater runoff from Sumner-Tapps Highway. KPG was selected to provide consulting services for this project through a qualification-based selection process. An hourly rate agreement with a maximum amount payable of \$180,027.64 was negotiated for the final design and construction management phase of the project. *"Do Pass Recommendation by the Committee"*

166th Widening: Federal Grant Acceptance (FHWA)

City Engineer Kosa stated this project will improve the 166th Ave and SR 410 off-ramps intersection that currently experience extreme traffic congestion. The City applied for federal funding in 2020 for the design phase of the project. Funds recently became available, and the City was awarded \$1,219,650. This will enable the City to complete the design without having to expend the committed local funds. The City is required to provide a 13.5% local match, which is within the existing budget. *"Do Pass Recommendation by the Committee"*

Director Dahlem updated the committee on projects.
