SUMMARY BACKGROUND:

The City's contract with Murrey's Disposal stipulates that rates will be adjusted annually based on two factors. The first factor is the change in landfill/disposal costs. In March 2022, Pierce County will be decreasing the landfill rate from \$168.51 per ton to \$166.45 per ton. The second factor allows Murrey's an annual inflation increase equal to 80% of the Consumer Price Index for the Seattle-Tacoma-Bellevue area for the period of October to October of the previous year. Eighty percent of the CPI change for this period is 5.23%. In total, the average residential rate increase is 4.69% and the average commercial rate increase is 4.29%. A detailed list of the proposed 2022 rates is attached to the Resolution as exhibit A. The public was provided a forty-five (45) day notice of the proposed rate increase, which is scheduled to go into effect March 1, 2022.

Assistant District Manager Steven Hopkins from Murrey's Disposal will be available to answer additional questions.

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SUMNER, WASHINGTON,
ADOPTING THE 2022 MURREY'S DISPOSAL COMPANY RATE INCREASE.**

WHEREAS, the City of Sumner's contract with Murrey's Disposal Company stipulates that the rates will be adjusted each year for a change in landfill tipping fees; and

WHEREAS, the contract allows for Murrey's to adjust rates based on 80% of the Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers for the Seattle-Tacoma-Bellevue area for the period of October to October of the previous year; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sumner provided the public with a 45-day notice of the proposed rate increase.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SUMNER, WASHINGTON, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Sumner City Council adopts the 2022 Murrey's Disposal Company rate increase, attached hereto as Exhibit A and adopted by reference.

Section 2. Corrections by City Clerk or Code Reviser. Upon approval of the city attorney, the city clerk and the code reviser are authorized to make necessary corrections to this resolution, including but not limited to the correction of clerical errors; or references to other local, state, or federal laws, codes, rules, or regulations.

Section 3. Upon passage and approval of this Resolution, it shall take effect March 1, 2022.

SUMMARY BACKGROUND:

The City Council adopted the Parks & Trail Plan update in 2018, providing guidance for the planning of Sumner's Parks and Trails. In 2019, a presentation of recommended projects and decision-making strategies was given to the Council. This included seeking property in underserved areas of Sumner as well as specific improvements to current parks. The strategies and direction helped the City obtain funding assistance from Pierce County Conservation Futures for the Bennett Property, and receive a donation from David and Janell Qunell for a small park in the Rivergrove Community. The Rainier View Park Covered Court was selected for funding through the Recreation and Conservation Office as well as the Local Communities Program from the State Legislature.

Staff recommends a six year improvement plan be presented and approved by the Council annually, similar to the Transportation Improvement Plan. The 2022-2027 Parks Improvement Plan (PIP) will establish and prioritize the parks projects for the next six years.

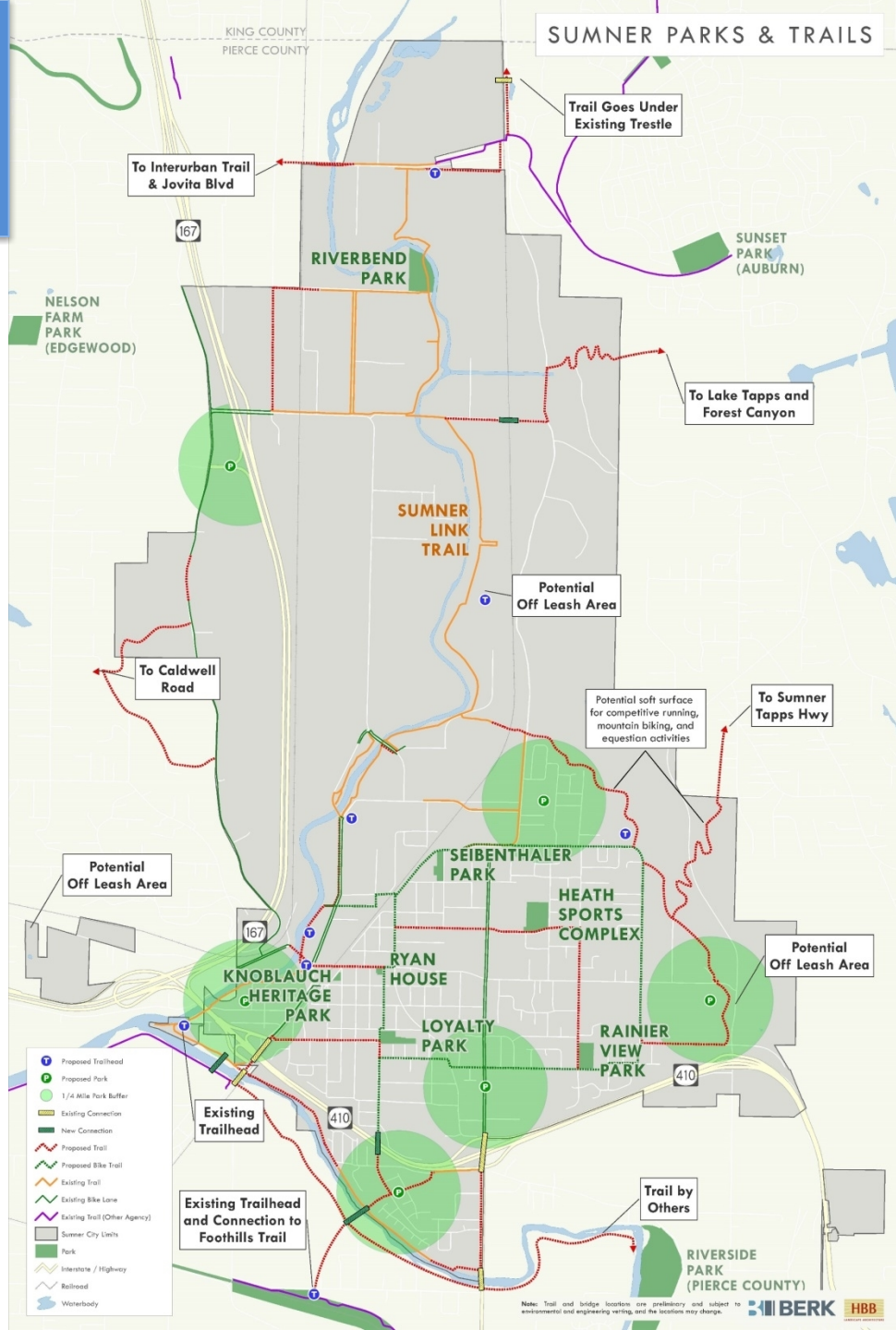

SUMMARY BACKGROUND:

Staff has been working with HBB Landscape Architecture and the community to identify programing and activities that people want to see and do in the parks. The efforts started in June with site visits and research. There was a kickoff survey as well as a booth at Nights On Ryan to engage the public and seek feedback. Those results were used to create alternative concepts that were shared in a follow-up survey and were the main focus of the Open House. We have narrowed down the alternative concepts and are excited to share the preferred concepts. Once the preferred concept is approved, a Master Plan will be completed for each location. The Master Plan is intended to guide future implementation and is a tool for securing funding.

Master plans are about expressing a **long-term vision** for your parks. Features shown in a master plan include the type of **activities** you might want to experience, like playgrounds and picnic areas, or the **programming** and **events** that you might want to occur in the park.

A master plan also includes the infrastructure and circulation needed to support those activities like walkways, parking, lighting, and restrooms. Ultimately, a master plan is intended to guide future implementation, with more detailed design and funding to follow at a later date.

It's critical that the master plan **reflect the vision, character, and values** important to you and your community.
