This is a recap of what happened in the short 2022 session, which also sets the foundation for our 2023 Agenda.

In general, the underlining theme you will hear is unpredictability. We'll talk about issues as well as the tone in the session. Our Agenda becomes even more important to provide Sumner with both focus on our needs and flexibility to respond quickly to unexpected bills and proposals.

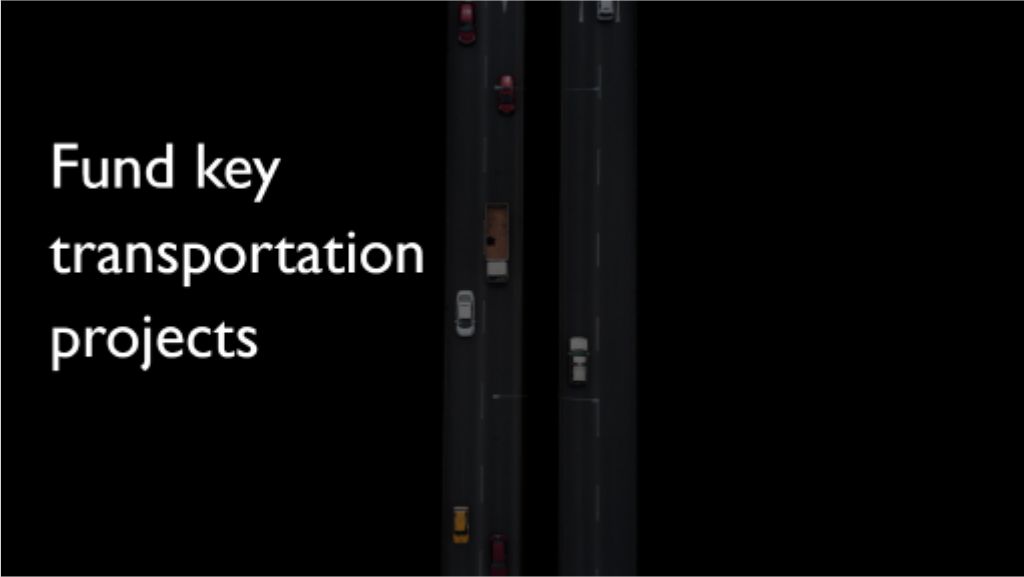

‘22 LEGISLATIVE AGENDA

- Fund shovel-ready \$7 million for Stewart Road Bridge construction. **No luck this session**
- Transfer existing \$500,000 funding for SR 410 Interchanges. **Yes, with Sumner amendment in Supplemental Transportation Budget**
- Include SR410/166th Interchange and SR 167 Southbound third lane in any new transportation package. **Very few new project in Transportation Package “Move Ahead Washington”**

- Restore salmon habitat and protect businesses against flooding by funding the Stewart Road Bridge construction. **No luck this session; other projects gaining spotlight**
- Support local planning for best regional impact

‘22 LEGISLATIVE AGENDA

What passed this session:

- **HB 1719** – clarified that shotguns or any device used to deploy less lethal munitions are not “prohibited military equipment” previously banned in 2021 by HB 1054.
- **HB 2037** – clarifies key definitions “necessary” “physical force” and “totality of circumstances.” Clarifies when an officer may use physical force in the performance of their duties. Gained back the ability to prevent a person fleeing on foot from a lawful detention.
- **HB 1735** – companion to HB 2037 – clarified other non-criminal situations when an officer may use physical force in the performance of their duties.

‘22 LEGISLATIVE AGENDA

What did not pass:

- **SB 5919 – Would have made changes to a prior bill limiting when police can pursue a vehicle.**
- **Several bills providing dedicated funding for law enforcement & CJTC failed. No bills were introduced to address gaps in controlled substances laws caused by Blake decision and last session laws.**

CAPITAL ASK



- Rivergrove Pedestrian Bridge
 - Rep. Robertson very enthusiastic.
 - Not this session! On the agenda for next session.
 - Pursuing funding options through WSDOT's Active Transportation programs

“RANDOM” SESSION

- Prejudgment Interest Bill SB 5155 = cities would either be unable to obtain insurance coverage and/or be forced to cut other services to address much higher insurance costs. **Delayed with questions, expect return, strong opposition from local governments, on next Agenda.**
- HB 1782 = middle housing bill, transition planning to State with no regard for infrastructure, local plans and local engagement process. **Expect return next session.**
- Proposal to remove officers' ability to stop a vehicle for failure to stop or lack of license. **One example that tells us policing will remain a topic with a variety of ideas in future sessions.**

- **Senator Phil Fortunato:** secured \$500,000 for Traffic Ave. and helped on Senate side with bill to transfer to 166th Ave interchange.
- **Rep. Drew Stokesbary:** helped protect City's insurance.
- **Rep. Eric Robertson:** pushed special bill to transfer \$500,000 on House side.
- **25th Legislators:** continue to listen to Sumner's neighboring needs

LOOKING TO '23

- 
- **White River:** work with PSE to bridge funding gap.
 - **Stewart Road:** revisit after grant options/Federal results.
 - **State Planning:** continue to watch AWC & be vocal about local engagement.
 - **Police Reform:** expect more
 - **Expect the Unexpected:** provide input to 2023 agenda and building flexibility to respond to wide range of potential issues.

HAVING AN AGENDA

- Clarifies to the public and partners the City's position on topics (direct)
- Gives Mayor & staff permission to comment on fast-moving topics (indirect)
- 2023 Agenda will be difficult to predict the unpredictable.
- Election Year – Lots of open seats in WA Legislature; could mean changes
- **Please keep Carmen informed if you hear of topics arising even before the '23 Agenda is before Council.**
